**Description**

**Isotype** Murine IgM

**Specificity** Clone SMØ, produces mouse IgM immunoglobulin reactive with a single chain 90 kD membrane

glycoprotein. It was clustered at the Leucocyte Typing Workshop IV [3].

## **Antigen distribution**

CD36, or platelet GPIV (GPIIIb), expression is restricted to platelets, monocytes, macrophages, erythrocyte precursors, adipocytes, activated keratinocytes, and some endothelial and epithelial cells [1,2]. CD36 is expressed as a multifunctional glycoprotein that functions as a cell adhesion molecule, a scavenger receptor, a signal transducer and in the pathogenesis of malaria [1].

## **Summary**

CD36 on macrophages functions in the phagocytic clearance of apoptotic cells. Interaction between CD36 and anionic phospholipids in the outer leaflet of the plasma membrane may contribute to the recognition of apoptotic cells by macrophages. CD36 is a receptor on endothelial cells for plasmodium falciparum infected erythrocytes [5], as a receptor on platelets and monocytes for thrombospondin; and it may function as a collagen adhesion receptor on platelets [2,4,5].

## **Applications**

Monoclonal antibody CD36, clone SMØ, can be applied in flow cytometry for analysis of blood and bone marrow samples or in immunohistochemistry using cytospots or frozen tissue sections. CD36 is used for bone marrow differentiation and erythroid lineage differentiation. In immunohistochemistry it is reactive with some endothelial cells and adipocytes [3].

## Usage

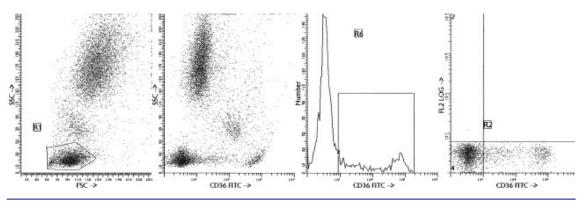
All these reagents are effectively formulated for direct immunofluorescent staining of human tissue for flow cytometric analysis using  $10~\mu l/10^6$  leukocytes for singles and  $20~\mu l/10^6$  leukocytes in case of dual and triple combinations. Since applications vary, each investigator should titrate the reagent to obtain optimal results.

# Representative data

Staining with clone SMØ (CD36), is illustrated by flow cytometry using a blood sample form a healthy human volunteer. Direct staining was performed using 10  $\mu$ l of the FITC-conjugated monoclonal antibody and 100  $\mu$ l blood sample.



### Limitations

- 1. Conjugates with brighter fluorochromes, like PE and APC, will have a greater separation than those with dyes like FITC and CyQ. When populations overlap, the percentage of positive cells using a selected marker can be affected by the choice of fluorescent label.
- 2. Use of monoclonal antibodies in patient treatment can interfere with antigen target recognition by this reagent. This should be taken into account when samples are analyzed from patients treated in this fashion. IQ Products has not characterized the effect of the presence of therapeutic antibodies on the performance of this reagent.
- 3. Reagents can be used in different combinations, therefore laboratories need to become familiar performance characteristics of each antibody in relation with the combined markers in normal and abnormal samples.
- 4. Reagent data performance is based on EDTA-treated blood. Reagent performance can be affected by the use of other anticoagulants.

## Reagents and materials required but not supplied

- 1. Flow cytometer
- 2. Flow cytometry disposable 12 x 75-mm capped polystyrene test tubes
- 3. Micropipette with disposable tips
- 4. Vortex mixer
- 5. Centrifuge
- 6. IQ Lyse erythrocyte lysing solution (IQP-199)
- 7. IQ Starfigs fixation and permeabilization solution (IOP-200)
- 8. PBS (phosphate-buffered saline)
- 9. 1% paraformaldehyde solution in PBS (store at 2-8 °C in amber glass for up to 1 week)

# Immunofluorescence staining and lysing protocol

# Flow cytometry method for use with purified monoclonal antibodies

- 1. Add 100 µl of EDTA-treated blood (i.e. approx. 106 leukocytes) to a 5 ml reagent tube. The content of one tube is sufficient to perform one test.
- Add to each tube 10 µl of purified monoclonal antibody\*. Vortex the tube to ensure thorough mixing of 2. antibody and cells.
- 3. Incubate the tube for 15 minutes at room temperature in the dark.
- Wash the labeled cells by adding 2 ml of PBS containing 0.001% ( $^{V}$ / $_{V}$ ) Heparin, vortexing and centrifuging (2 min 1000 x g.) and discard the supernatant.
- 5. Add 50 µl of 1:10 dilution of IQ Products F(ab)<sub>2</sub> Rabbit Anti Mouse IgG fluorescent conjugate, [FITC (IQP-190F); R-PE (IOP-190R)] in PBS containing 0.001% ( $^{\vee}/_{\vee}$ ) Heparin to the tube. It is recommended that the tube is protected from light.
- Mix by vortexing and incubate for 15 minutes at room temperature in the dark. 6.
- Add 100 µl of IQ Lyse (IQP-199 ready-to-use) and mix immediately. 7.
- Incubate for 10 minutes at room temperature in the dark. 8.
- Add 2 ml of demineralized water and incubate for 10 minutes in the dark. 9
- 10. Centrifuge the labeled cell suspension for 2 minutes at 1000 x g.
- Remove the supernatant and resuspend the cells in 200 µl of PBS\*\*. 11.
- Analyze by flow cytometry within four hours (alternatively, the cells may be fixed by 0.05% of formaline in buffered saline for analysis the next day. Some antigens are readily destroyed upon fixation and this should be taken into account when using this alternative).

- Flow cytometry method for use with labeled (FITC, R-PE, Cy-Q or APC) monoclonal antibodies Add 100  $\mu$ l of EDTA-treated blood (i.e. approx.  $10^6$  leukocytes) to a 5 ml reagent tube. The content of 1. one tube is sufficient to perform one test.
- 2. Add to each tube 10 µl of labeled monoclonal antibody\*. Vortex the tube to ensure thorough mixing of antibody and cells.
- 3. Incubate the tube for 15 minutes at room temperature in the dark.
- Add 100 µl of IQ Lyse (IQP-199 ready-to-use) and mix immediately. 4.
- 5. Incubate for 10 minutes at room temperature in the dark.
- Add 2 ml of demineralized water and incubate for 10 minutes in the dark. 6.
- Centrifuge the labeled cell suspension for 2 minutes at 1000 x g.
- Remove the supernatant and resuspend the cells in 200 µl of PBS\*\*. 8.
- Analyze by flow cytometry within four hours (alternatively, the cells may be fixed by 0.05% of formaline in buffered saline for analysis the next day. Some antigens are readily destroyed upon fixation and this should be taken into account when using this alternative).

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## - C - Flow cytometry method for use with dual and triple combinations

- Add 100 µl of EDTA-treated blood (i.e. approx. 10<sup>6</sup> leukocytes) to a 5 ml reagent tube. The content of one tube is sufficient to perform one test.
  - For combinations with anti-kappa and/or anti-lambda Ig see application note below.
- 2. Add to each tube 20 µl of labeled monoclonal antibody combination\*.
- 3. Vortex the tube to ensure thorough mixing of antibody and cells.
- 4. Incubate the tube for 15 minutes at room temperature in the dark.
- 5. Add 100 µl of IQ Lyse (IQP-199 ready-to-use) and mix immediately.
- 6. Incubate for 10 minutes at room temperature in the dark.
- 7. Add 2 ml of demineralized water and incubate for 10 minutes in the dark.
- 8. Centrifuge the labeled cell suspension for 2 minutes at 1000 x g.
- 9. Remove the supernatant and resuspend the cells in 200 µl of PBS\*\*.
- 10. Analyze by flow cytometry within four hours (alternatively, the cells may be fixed by 0.05% of formaline in buffered saline for analysis the next day. Some antigens are readily destroyed upon fixation and this should be taken into account when using this alternative).
  - \* Appropriate mouse Ig isotype control samples should always be included in any labeling study \* PBS: Phosphate Buffered Saline, pH 7.2

# Application note for anti-kappa and/or anti-lambda Ig combinations

Add 2 ml of PBS containing 0.001% (v/v) Heparin (**prewarmed to 37 °C**) to the cell suspension Vortex, centrifuge (2 min at 300x g) and discard the supernatant Repeat this step twice

Resuspend the pelleted blood cells in 100 µl PBS containing 0.001% (v/v) Heparin

### Handling and Storage

Antibodies are supplied either as 100 tests per vial (1 ml) for singles or 50 tests per vial (1 ml) for dual and triple combinations. They are supplied in 0.01 M sodium phosphate, 0.15 M NaCl; pH 7.3, 0.2% BSA, 0.09% sodiumazide (NaN $_3$ ). Store the vials at 2-8 °C. Monoclonal antibodies should be protected from prolonged exposure to light. Reagents are stable for the period shown on the vial label when stored properly.

### Warranty

Products sold hereunder are warranted only to conform to the quantity and contents stated on the label at the time of delivery to the customer. ### Characterization
